



ARMA Student Research Competition 2026 Instructions

Thank you for participating in the ARMA student research competition. This event will take place on May 5 – June 8, 2026. For your reference, the following information might be helpful.

1. Every ARMA Student Chapter may be represented by up to five graduate students for the contest. Abstract submissions will be considered in the order they are received.
2. The contest will be virtual (on a platform such as Zoom or Teams).
3. If selected, the student must prepare and present research work on an appropriate topic with a 15-minute presentation. Presentations longer than 15 min or shorter than 10 min will get point deduction. Students must be present at the virtual meeting during their scheduled time slots to answer questions about their presentations.
4. The abstract must be between 250-500 words and should be formatted as the enclosed template. Students should submit their abstracts via the following google form:

5. Students are expected to acknowledge sources outside their work by proper references.
6. The deadline for submitting abstracts is 05 May 2026.
7. The expected days for the presentations are May 5 – June 8, 2026.
8. Winners will be acknowledged with cash rewards.
9. NOTE: Due to U.S. regulations, ARMA may unable to send prizes to some countries.
10. The winners will be awarded at the ARMA 2026 Tucson Symposium.

Abstract:

These instructions detail the recommended abstract template and are intended to demonstrate the correct formatting for ARMA SRC 2026 abstract submissions. Please note that while this sample includes highlights and other text decorations for illustration purposes, such formatting **should not be used** in the final submitted abstracts.

Abstracts must be between **250 and 500 words**. The document should begin with the title in Arial, 16 pt font, followed by the full name of the candidate and their level of study (Bachelor, Master, or Ph.D.) in Arial, 12 pt font. The main body of the abstract must be written in **Times New Roman, 12 pt** font to ensure uniformity across submissions.

At the end of the abstract, include **3 to 5 keywords**, separated by a semicolon (;).

Candidates are advised **not to include their university name or logo** anywhere in the abstract. Additionally, figures and tables are not allowed in the abstract submission.
